"All I want is to serve the public, but this is life or death. It's scary not to have employer coverage."

Lisa from Decatur, GA

Lisa is the Executive Director of a non-profit organization in Georgia that provides legal advocacy for low-income women and girls. Lisa has major health needs, including a brain tumor and seizures, so having health coverage is literally life or death for her. She had ACA coverage, but her 2016 income will fall below the poverty line (\$11,770) so she will lose the subsidy that made her coverage affordable. She would get a second job to help bring her income up, but her doctor wants her to stop working completely. She went to law school and became an attorney to help people in need, but now she cannot make enough money to take care of her health needs.
